- Transition Update:
 - Activities have continued; consultant (WSP) submitted a draft Transition Plan to the staff, and is under review right now, as well as a draft implementation schedule.
 - The Steering Group, which includes technical staff from the Local Funding Partners including legal representation, continues to meet on a monthly basis. The Working Group is also working through negotiations for the remaining items.
 - Meetings have been set up with Lynx to discuss terms for a potential agreement, including a meeting this scheduled this afternoon (12/15).

Agenda Item: Reports - Agency Update

Presenter: Charles M. Heffinger

- Secretary Tyler reminded everyone of the significant damage in Osceola County from the hurricane and how FDOT, the consultants, and contractors worked 24 hours a day to restore service to that area. He expressed gratitude for the hard work of the consultants and contractors to get it back up and running, especially since it was more than just SunRail that was impacted. It was Amtrak and CSX, as well, which are large parts of the economy here. Secondly, he wanted to congratulate the Board for having an aggressive meeting schedule for 2023, knowing that much business will need to be worked through.
 - In response to his remarks, Mayor Dyer did remind everyone of the six scheduled meetings with time set aside for workshops, if necessary.
- Hurricane Response
 - o Two major storms (Ian and Nicole), impacted service days by almost 3 weeks
 - o Within hours of storm, crews cleared tracks, assessing damage, reinstalling gates
 - o Hurricane Ian repairs completed in less than 2 weeks, with incentivized bonuses going to contractors
 - YTD ridership still 31% higher than 2021
- Orlando Magic Train to the Game
 - o Orlando Magic offering 10:30pm service south from Church St
 - 30 weekday home games marketed to ticketholders and riders
 - Ride SunRail free with game day ticket as proof of purchase
 - Ridership up 47% over last season
- Stranger Trains
 - SunRail partnered with Kissimmee Main Street for Boo! On Broadway, 10/28/22, with extended northbound service at 9pm.
 - Over 800 families took SunRail to and from the event
 - 3,000 goodie bags with safety information were handed out during the event by Evolve, our marketing group
- Festive Fridays
 - Extended southbound service was offered every Friday from 11/25 12/30
 - o Promoting local events, dining, and rail safety
 - o Incredible community partnerships with giveaways and prizes

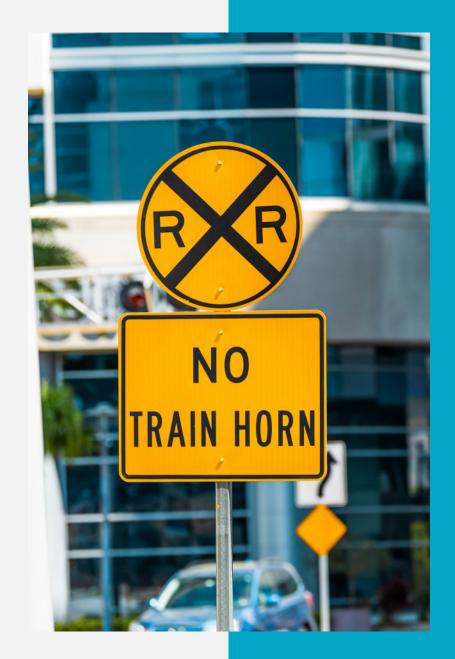

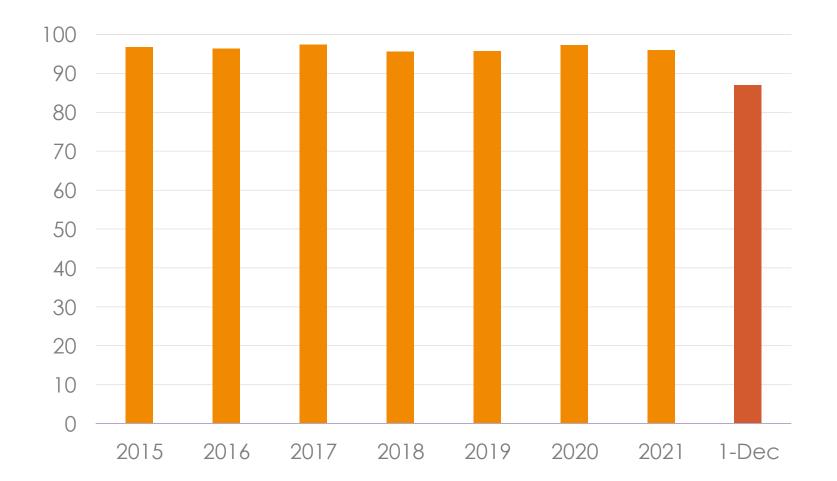

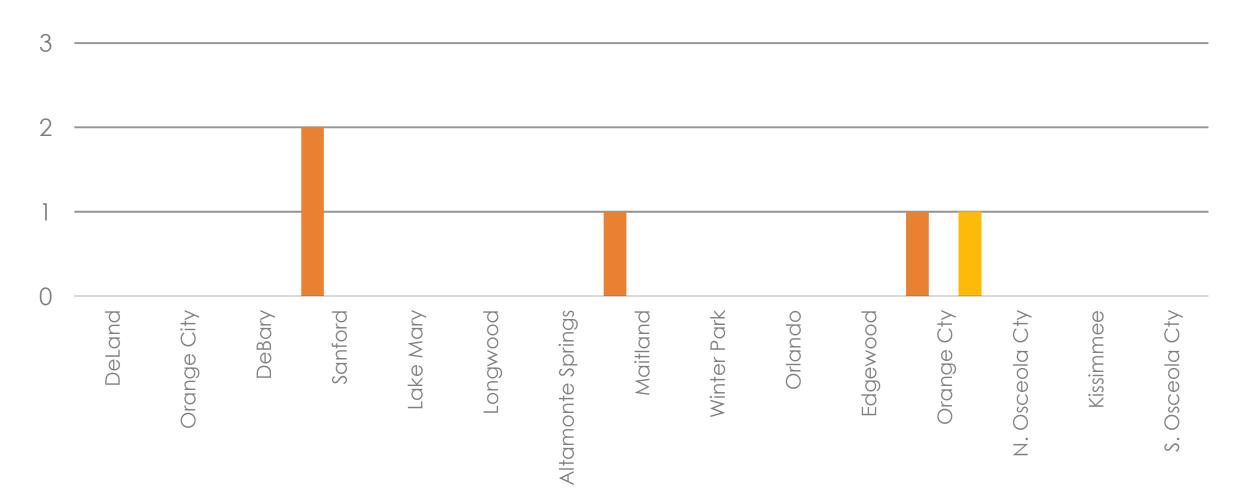

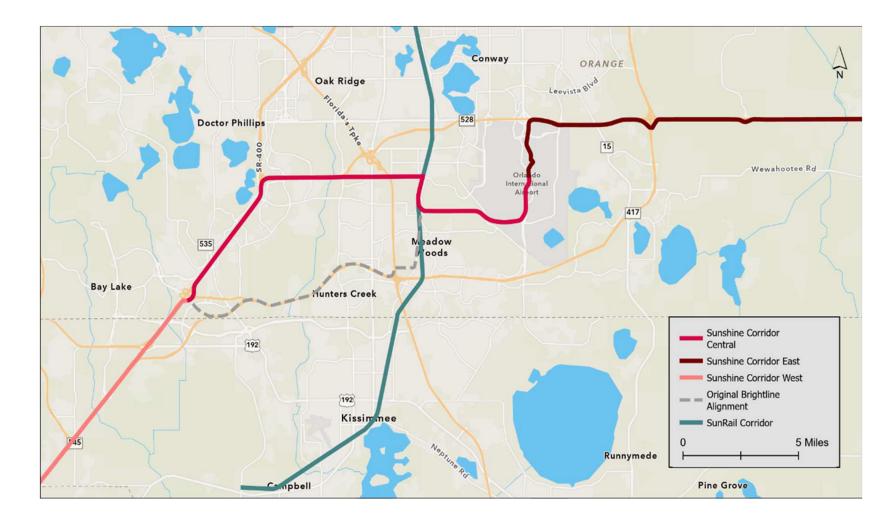

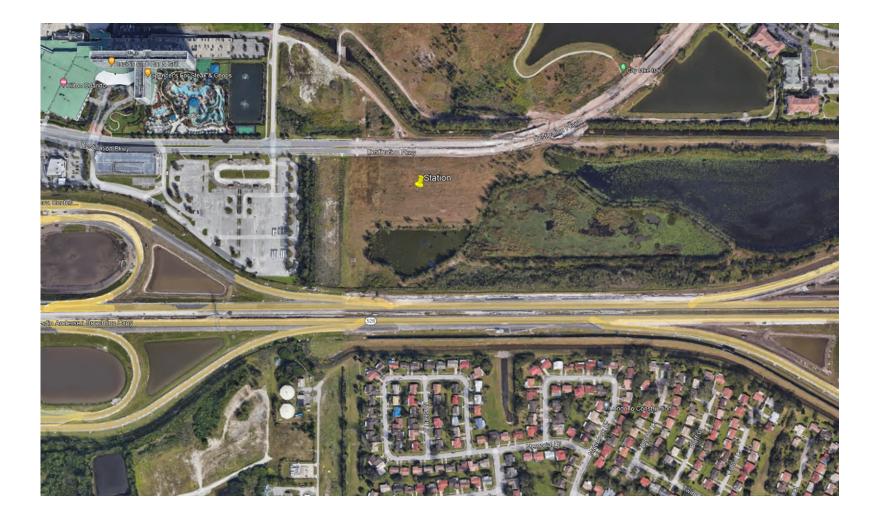

AVERAGE DAILY RIDERSHIP

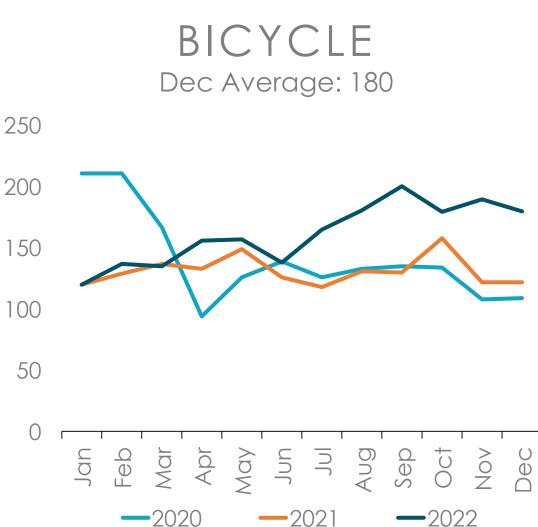

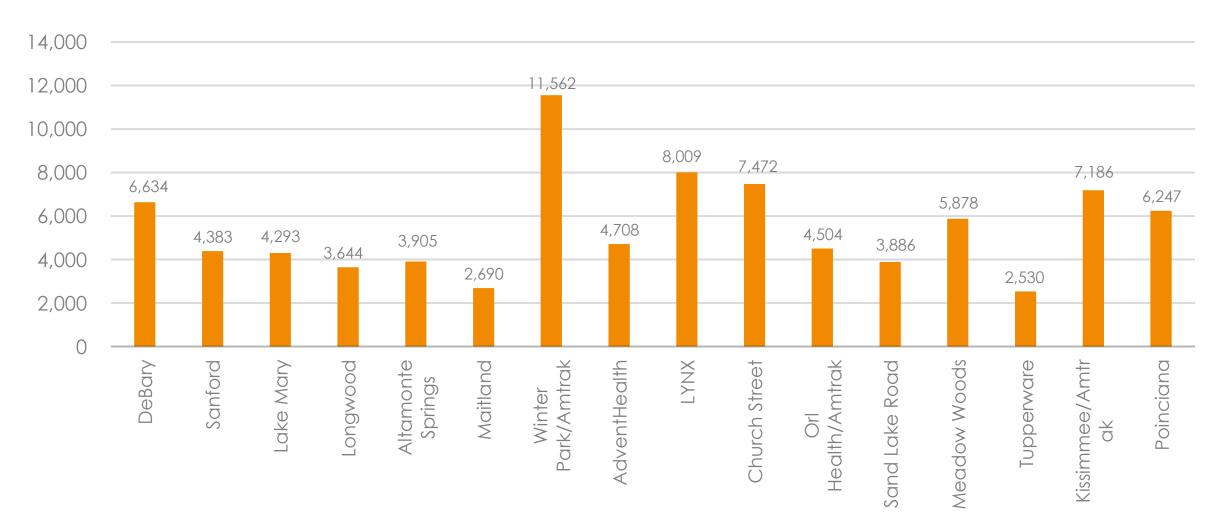

RIDERSHIP DECEMBER 2022

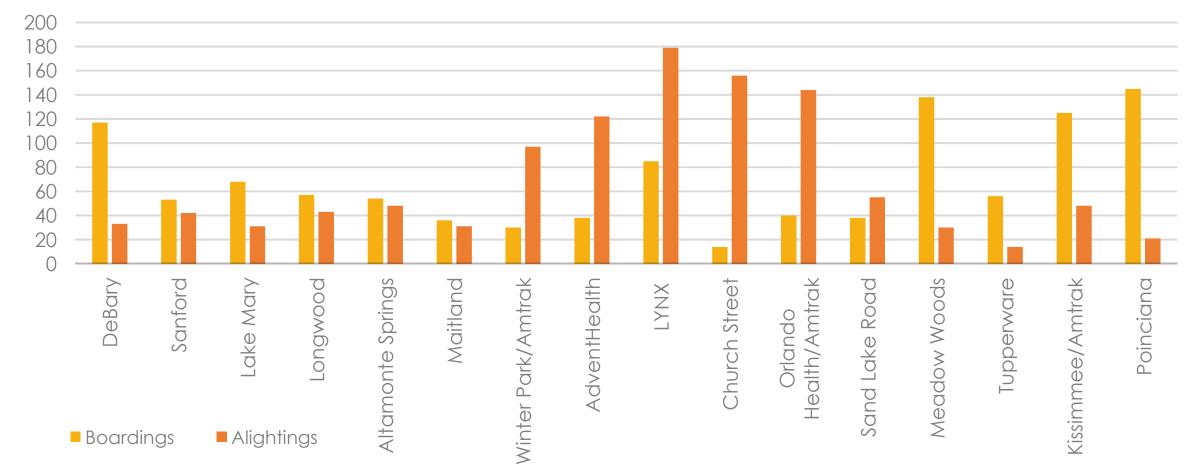

REVENUE INCIDENTS BY CITY/COUNTY

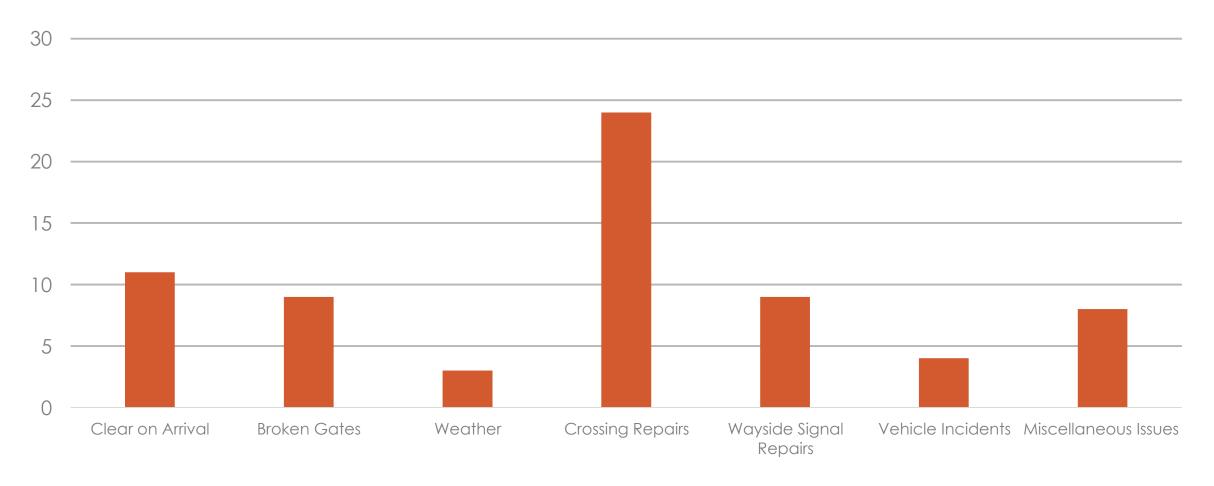

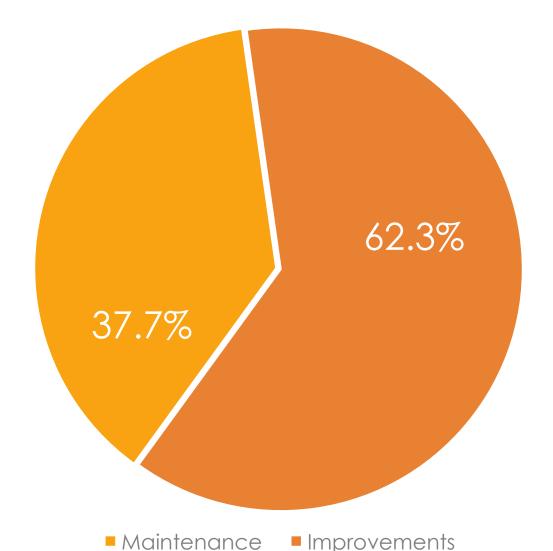
