#### Announcements

• The Locally Funded Agreement (LFA) final draft is scheduled to go to the various boards for approval this month and the CFCRC in December. Potentially, the Local Funding Partners will fund the operations and maintenance starting January 1<sup>st</sup> through December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2025. All the responsibilities the Department previously had are going to stay with the Department. Funding partners are going to pay bills. Next couple years or so, hopefully we can go through the next phase of transition. Finishing up issues with CSX and FTA is going to take some time. Those are going to be some processes that we will have to work through together.

### Agency Update:

Presenter: David Cooke

- Hurricanes Helene and Milton
  - <sup>o</sup> Before, during and after the hurricanes, SunRail was in constant communication with riders through social media and on SunRail.com for all updates pertaining to changes in service.
  - Service was suspended to prepare the corridor and secure equipment such as the crossing gates.
  - Within hours of storms passing, crews cleared tracks, assessed damage, and reinstalled gates for regular service.
  - Were able to resume service quickly following Hurricane Helene.
  - Were shut down for three days in October for Hurricane Milton.
- Rail Safety Week Success!
  - Education and enforcement days were held throughout the week of September 21–27, 2024 at specified grade crossings with local law enforcement presence from all four counties.

- Results are still coming in; however, in one day alone, nearly 200 warnings and citations were issued.
- Media availability day and engineer ride along increased engagement and boosted earned media coverage.
- Train-To-the-Game Is Back!!!
  - SunRail and the Orlando Magic have partnered again for Train-to-the-Game for all 27 weekday home games in the 2024/2025 season.
  - This promotion allows fans to ride FREE with their game day ticket during the weeknights.
  - An additional train was added to the schedule that extends southbound service from Church Street Station at 11:06 p.m. This additional train is sponsored by the Orlando Magic in addition to the regular 10:30 p.m. northbound service.
- Boo! On Broadway
  - o Kissimmee Main Street's Annual Event took place on Friday, October 25, 2024.
  - Families rode SunRail to the decorated Kissimmee "Spellbound Station" and walked to the event where SunRail had a booth distributing safety information and treats.
  - SunRail experienced an impressive 24% ridership increase compared to the last two years.
  - Special thanks to Alstom for providing an additional northbound train.
- Mobility Week! October 28<sup>th</sup> November 1<sup>st</sup>
  - Mobility Week was a statewide cooperative effort by the FDOT and its partner agencies to promote awareness of safe, multimodal transportation choices.
  - Events during the week:
    - Try Transit Tuesday October 29<sup>th</sup> free service all day in collaboration with LYNX; increase up to about 6,200 passengers that day for PRIDE Transit Tuesday.
    - Safety Fair at LYNX Station October 29<sup>th</sup>.
    - Multimodal Workshop at City Hall October 29<sup>th</sup>.
    - Rollins College new student commuter lounge grand opening October 29<sup>th</sup>.
    - Trail to Rail Bike ride with St. John's River-to-Sea Alliance November 1<sup>st</sup>.
- SunCard Account Conversion
  - o SunRail is reminding customers that the holidays are a great time to ride!
  - The promotional 25 cent SunCard offer expires on December 31<sup>st</sup>, and SunRail will be contacting customers who still have funds on a yellow legacy SunCard to transfer their balance.
  - May be some changes during the upcoming months when some of the winter residents return and want to switch over.
  - Direct emails, social media outreach, Ambassador education, and more will direct customers to the simple online transfer processes.
- Average Daily Ridership September 4,628.
- On-Time Performance September Goal = 95%; Actual = 80.13%; Contract = 98.42%.
  - A few incidents on the corridor that didn't help the situation, which resulted in 80% OTP which is less than the norm. Looking for that to come back up in October. Some of this is attributed to the construction work that's still going on at the south end of the corridor.

  - Above Average On-Time 2 Days; 19 Operating Days; Ran 760 Trains.
- FY 24/25 Operating Budget Update This is for the FDOT FY as we move into the transition, how we work through the budget that works for everyone. Basically, we have a little over \$80 million budget annually. Annual revenue is just over \$30 million and that includes our 5307 and 5337 grant funds.

#### LYNX Bus Connectivity

#### **Presenter:** Bruce Detweiler

- September saw a 10% increase compared to last year. September marks the end of our FY2024. When we compare that to FY2023, we had a 12% increase in total ridership.
- Feeder route service for Phase 2 South in September averaged a 4% increase total for fixed routes and a 1% decrease for Neighbor Link service.
- The Sand Lake Station to the Airport corridor saw a 61% increase when compared to September of last year.

#### Votran Bus Connectivity

### Presenter: Bobbie King

- Overall, annually we're down about 1,000 riders. August and September, we're a little bit low. Suspect that's because some of the riders have gone to the DeLand Station since this is specifically the DeBary Station ridership. All year, we're below the average from the previous year.
- VoRide is our new micro transit service that services both DeLand and DeBary. We have a little bit of ridership for VoRide in DeBary. The reason it might be quite a bit lower than DeLand is because we do have feeder bus service at that station. Many of the riders are using the bus.
- The DeLand Station had a pretty big increase in September, and we'll see that again in October.
- Average daily ridership is somewhat low.
- Our other service at DeLand is a circulator that's paid for initially by FDOT, and now by the City of DeLand, and runs 12:30 PM to 7:30 PM daily. Average daily ridership is about 18 over the last couple of months. We did see some very large numbers in October; some days were even 50 riders a day. Perhaps, we may see an increase in October.

### SunRail Transition Update

### Presenter: John Booker

- An update on transition issues for the Commission meeting next week includes having two action items on the agenda.
- QuickBooks is part of the banking operations, so we asked for Board approval for that service to be entered into with the Commission.
- The banking relationship is predicated on piggybacking off a Chase Bank contract that LYNX currently has in force; we'll take that to the Board as well.
- Banking has proven to be a little bit challenging, but our goal is to meet the time frames that the Operations Phasing Agreement has. As of January 1<sup>st</sup>, we as in the Local Funding Partners can begin paying the bills for FDOT. Thank you FDOT for your generosity over the years. This region is ready to start paying for SunRail operations.
